Fun Classes Offered for HLAA Show:

- **Best of Show & Best of Opposite** for all shows All Grand Champions Compete.
- * Dam & Cria Female Llama shows with her Cria (under 6mo.) at her side.
- **Best Bred and Owned** This Class is for Llamas which have the same owner when bred, birthed, and at time of show. (Female and Male Classes offered)
- **Gambler's Choice** Entry \$5 per llama or alpaca. This is a timed obstacle course for Saturday & Sunday as soon as alpaca halter is done, that does not follow any rule. Do what you can to get your Llama or Alpaca through the course and complete as many obstacles as you can. **First Places gets\$75% for enter fee, second places \$25% of enters.**
- * Old Timers Obstacle- This fun course is for our 'older' crowd. Handlers must be over 60 years of age and their lamas must be over 10 years of age. No jumps or change of pace. Show the young ones how it's done!
- **Leaping Llama & Llama Limbo** Entry \$2 per class. Will be held **on Friday night at 8pm.** See how high they can go and how low they can go! Alpacas and Llamas are welcome to be part of this class.
- * Open Costume Class- 1 Youth & 1 Adult Class to be held Friday night after pizza party is done.
- * **Silent Auction** This will be during the show day on both Saturday and Sunday. This is to <u>help our Youth</u> Scholarship program.
- * Photo contest- No Entry fee. Theme is Halloween, Fall and/or Free style. See entry form.
- Finished Fiber craft classes- \$5 for entry- see Entry form for rules.
- * **Sponsorship** is a very important part of our show. Each sponsor will be announced during our show and name placed in the show catalog. Thank you for helping, we can't do this show without your help! Please think about helping this year.
- Join HLAA right now with your entries, and you are paid up for the year of 2022. You get 3 months free. (If you have an adult membership already you can renew at this point, if you wish).
- Buckeye Regional is Double ALSA points
- Top 6 places in all approved classes will Qualify for entry in the ALSA Grand National Show

- No pre-qualification required to show at Buckeye Regional
- **Walking Fleece:** starts at 4:00 p.m. on Friday night and ends at 8:00 p.m. It restarts at 8:00 a.m. Saturday and ends at 9:00 am.
- * Shorn Fleece: 2 ounce sample only! See ALSA web site if you need proper paperwork for show.
- **Health Requirements:** All animals coming from out of state must have a veterinarian health certificate dated within 30 days of exhibition.
- **Eligibility:** All llamas must have ILR certificates except for animals for Youth or non-breeder ALSA classes.
- * Show Rules: Dual sanctioned ILR & ALSA show. The show will run according to the rules/guidelines in the ALSA current edition handbook and the current edition of the ILR Show Division guidelines.
- * Arrival: Arrival time for all exhibitors starts at 12pm on Friday. Stalls will be pre-assigned.
- Stalling: 10 x 12 stalls located in horse barn, 3 adults per stall and 4 juveniles per stall. Exhibitors will provide their own bedding. And clean out your bedding before you leave.
- **Departure:** All bedding must be put outside at the end of barn before departure. Please!
- **Manure:** Please do not put any straw, hay or manure in trash cans! Please put it all outside at the end of the barn. Thanks!
- **Wool & age Division**: Each animal must be entered in its appropriate age and wool division as specified in the ALSA & ILR Guidelines. Animal wool division may not be changed after entries close unless moved with the approval of the judge.

Wool Division:

Suri: The fiber of a Suri Llama should have a natural luster and hang and drape over the llamas body, forming a natural part along the spine. The fibers are grouped into a very distinctive and well defined lock structure, which is indicated by the many individual separate locks of fiber formed at the skin and carrying out to the ends of each lock.

Silky: Then fiber exhibits a very soft or silky handle, may exhibit some wave or crinkle but not crimp, and may exhibit some loft and luster. Guard hair is nearly indiscernible and coverage may vary from light to heavy.

Classic/Light: Minimal body wool, short neck wool with smooth legs.

Medium: Moderate to long body wool, minimal to moderate neck wool, smooth to moderate leg wool.

Heavy/Extremely Heavy: Abundant body and neck wool with minimal to abundant leg wool.

Non-Breeder, Get of Sire, Produce of Dam: See association guidelines with questions.

Age division:

Llama age division:

Juvenile 5 to 12 months of age

Yearling 12 to 24 months of age

Two-year-old 24 to 36 months of age

Adult 36 months of age and over

Youth age Division:

Junior: Handler age 7 through 11

Intermediate: Handler age 12 through 14

Senior: Handler age 15 through 18

Performance Classes:

- An animal may only be shown in one performance class/division, except for Sub-Jr.
- Novice Class: Now the same for both Associations. No more than 4 Grand/Reserves.
- Advanced and Masters may be combined depending on entries.
- Camping: \$25 a night.
